

# EQUESTRIAN SECTION Chief Steward: Tracy Turner

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES This Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS), affiliation 509, and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS Classes whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the Rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS. This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes. Only one pony in each of the following classes will qualify and the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE ponies placed in each 19 class will qualify. Classes 203, 204, 219 & 220. Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor. Please note Rule 43 BSPS Rule book HAT TAGGING IN BSPS CLASSES IS COMPULSORY – NO RIDER WILL BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE IN THE BSPS CLASSES UNLESS THEY COMPLY WITH THIS RULE. Bellingham Show will not be offering hat tagging and any competitor in BSPS classes not complying with this rule will not be eligible for any refund from Bellingham Show.

DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW (LIHS 13-18th December 2023) Classes 215, 216, 217, 218 gualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 3 to gualify. If second and third are ungualified, they will gualify for the BSHA qualifier (semi-final) at Addington Equestrian Centre on the Sunday 10th September. Qualification for Rising Star Supreme Final or BSHA National Championship Semi-Final will not go beyond third place. RULES Available to amateur members and nonmembers, please see Rule 7 in 2023 BSHA Rulebook. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at a HOYS Final (not including SFAS, but to include the top three placings in the SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the current season and two years prior to the current season (not including SFAS). Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead. Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 7 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down the line. No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes. JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.

The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified. **Entry £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee

**Class 216** Heavyweight Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms, but not exceeding 155cms, capable of carrying more than 14 stone. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Heavyweight Cob Supreme Final at the BSHA RISING STAR CLASSES 11 LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified. **Entry £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee

**Class 217** Maxi Cob: Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms - to be judged as Cobs. Judges must pay particular attention to type (i.e. short legged animals of COB type). To be shown hogged. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Maxi Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified. **Entry £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee

**Class 218** Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses retired from race training. The winner of the class will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. If already qualified the qualification will move down to no lower than third place. Semi-final places will be awarded to second and third place unless already qualified This class is open to competitors who work within the racing industry. **Entry £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee

FINALISTS FOR THE LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW A qualification card will be presented in the ring detailing how to confirm qualification and register with the BSHA. All finalists should be made aware that to enter the Supreme Final at the LIHS, they should be members of the BSHA. The BSHA will offer training clinics nearer the event to prepare all competitors before the finals. RISING STAR SEMI-FINAL QUALIFIERS: Classes 215, 216, 217 & 218 will qualify for the BSHA/LIHS Rising Star Semi Final at the Addington Equestrian Centre, Sunday 10th September 2023. **Class 219** BSPS HERITAGE LEAD REIN WORKING SPORTS PONY Mare or Gelding, 4yrs old and over, Mountain and Moorland registered ponies not exceeding 128cms. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5th birthday on the 1st January in the current year and not to attain their 10th birthday in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle.

Criteria The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. The rein MUST go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. The Leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.

RIDERS - Hats in accordance with BSPS Rules, Body Protector, Tweed Jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, Shirt, tie, boots and gloves. No Buttonholes LEADERS Country attire, Gentlemen Trilby Hats or Caps, Ladies modest hats.

Marks: Manners & Style whilst performing the test (including jumping) 60 Marks Type, Movement and Way of Going 20 Marks Presentation and Suitability of pony for the rider 20 Marks TOTAL 100 MARKS Method of Judging Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. Riders will not be asked to dismount. Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised. There will be NO conformation marks. Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed standards. **Entry £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee.

**Class 220 Judge Julia Furness** BSPS JUNIOR PERFORMANCE PONY Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over not exceeding 128 cms. Plaited ponies. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday on the 1st January in the current year. Any suitable bridle, no cantering except in individual show. Marks: Performance 60 Marks Presentation and suitability of pony for rider, 20 Marks Type, Movement and Way of Going 20 Marks TOTAL 100 Marks

Method of judging- Exhibitors will go round the ring as whole group, (no pull in). They will undertake a display (rather a than show) where they would need to show certain movements which will include walk, including a walk on a free rein, trot, canter on both reins, a canter circle, canter transitions on the straight, extension in canter on one rein and a halt. Competitors in these classes will not be stripped. **Entry fee £20.00** A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee

It is recommended that horses should not have whiskers trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes or with a vet's certificate).

#### **Equine Flu Advice**

In keeping with the current Showing Council guidelines, Bellingham Show Influenza policy is as follows: Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses and ponies attending Bellingham Show. The requirement for the first three vaccination are as followed: The first two vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter within 7 days of an El vaccination. This rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/ BEF and any changes will be notified via The Showing Council and ASAO websites.

Line 2 baking trays with baking parchment. Put all the biscuit dough ingredients into a bowl and beat together to make a smooth, soft paste. Chill the dough in the fridge for 15 minutes.

Fit a star nozzle in a piping bag. Spoon in half the mixture, then pipe it out on to the baking tray, spacing the biscuits well apart. The shape is up to you – you can do small swirls, stars or strips. Repeat with the remaining batter – you should end up with about 32 biscuits.

Chill the piped biscuits for at least half an hour, longer if it is a very hot day. This will help them keep their shape. When you are ready to bake the biscuits, preheat the oven to 190°C/Fan 170°/Gas 5. Bake the biscuits for 13–15 minutes until they are a pale golden colour and cooked through. Leave them to cool on the tray.

To make the filling, put the butter and icing sugar in a bowl and mix together. Use a spoon to start with, as this gives you more control and stops the icing sugar from flying everywhere. Once the mixture is crumbly, use electric beaters or beat more vigorously with a spoon until the mixture is very soft and light – it will increase a lot in volume too. Stir through vanilla and just enough milk to loosen the mixture a bit.

Using a palette knife, spread some of the filling on the underside of half the biscuits. Sprinkle with grated chocolate, if using. Spread the underside of the remaining biscuits with the jam or conserve, then sandwich together.

Leave the biscuits to set – chill them for half an hour if necessary – then store in an airtight tin. Dust with icing sugar before serving.

- 1. Competitions and premiums in this list are all open, except Classes where otherwise stated.
- 2. Closing date for entries will be strictly adhered to, at the Secretary's discretion.
- 3. Animals obtaining premiums to be the bona fide property of their exhibitor.
- 4. When there is no competition prizes will not be awarded except where the stock exhibited is thought worthy by the judges.
- 5.Neither the Society, in any of its officers or servants shall be in any way responsible, or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstance whatever) to Exhibitors or their employees, or any animal or article exhibited, or property brought in to the Show field or otherwise for anything else in connection with or arising out of, or attributable to the Society's Show; or these in any other condition, or regulations prescribed by the society, in relation thereto.
- 6.No exhibit shall bear any distinctive marks or placard other than the society's official number.
- 7. Entry fees as stated in each section.
- 8. The Society do not hold themselves responsible or liable for any stock sent to the show, though every precaution will be taken to protect exhibitors from loss or damage.
- 9.All disputed questions shall be referred to the Show Council, by whom they will be finally settled without appeal. All objections to the Judge's decision or otherwise must be lodged with the Secretary in writing, within one week from the closure of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £10 which is liable to forfeiture.
- 10. The Stewards shall have the power to order from the Show the stock or property belonging to any Exhibitor who shall infringe any of the regulations or conditions of the meeting, or shall refuse to comply with any instruction given by the Judges or Stewards.
- 11. All horses may be measured before entering the Judging Ring.
- 12. In no case shall a prize be awarded unless the Judges deem the stock of sufficient merit and the Judges will be specially cautioned not to award any prize to any animal showing signs of hereditary disease. The Judges may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeon if they deem it expedient.
- **13.** Horses must not be ridden around the Show Field in any circumstances.
- 14. The Society reserves to itself by its Council the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations or Prize Sheets and to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences on regards thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show. Also to refuse and to cancel any entries, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, vary or cancel awards of prizes, or reserve numbers and relax conditions as the Society may deem necessary.
- 15. Prize money shall be paid to the successful exhibitor on Show Day. Please follow separate rules of Procedure for claiming prize money.

# IMPORTANT RULES FOR PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY.

# It is intended this year to pay out the Prize Money of Bellingham Show by cash on Show Day. Your co-operation is requested to follow these rules very carefully.

- 1. The Society will pay out Prize Money to successful exhibitors on Show Day, except to Exhibitors whose exhibits are sent by post and unaccompanied.
- 2. Successful Exhibitors of postal and unaccompanied exhibits will receive their Prize Money by cheque after the Show by post.
- 3. The Prize Money for the Sheep, Equestrian and Dog sections will be attached to the prize winning tickets and given to successful exhibitors when the Judging of the class is complete.
- 4. Exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections must complete prize claim forms.
- 5. Prize money will be paid out at the Secretary's office between 14.00 and 16.30 on show day to the successful exhibitors in the Baking, Industrial and Craft sections.
- 6. Only ONE EXHIBITOR may claim on a PRIZE CLAIM FORM, but it can be used to claim more than one prize.
- 7. The PRIZE CLAIM FORM, when submitted for payment, will be checked with the Official Prize List and, if correct, paid. The prize claim form can be retained by the Cashier as the Receipt for the Prize Money.
- *8.* If any exhibitor is unable to collect their prize money they must claim by post on the official prize claim form.
- 9. If any Prize Money is not claimed on show day, it will be retained by the Society until the 30<sup>th</sup> of September of the current year after which date all claims will be considered VOID.
- 10. Claiming Exhibitors must be prepared to produce to the cashier their prize card as proof of identification.
- 11. PRIZE CLAIM FORMS may be obtained from the Stewards of the Secretary's Office.
